

On December 1, we begin a new liturgical year with the season of Advent, from the Latin "adventus," which means, "coming." The first verse of the first hymn in The Presbyterian Hymnal captures the meaning of this season:

Come, Thou long-expected Jesus, Born to set Thy people free; From our fears and sins release us; Let us find our rest in Thee.

Advent is a season of anticipation of the birth of Jesus and expectant hope for his coming again. Notwithstanding the Christmas carols we already are hearing, telling us that "Christ the Savior is born," Mary will be "great with child" until after sunset on December 24. Then, with the birth of Jesus, the season of Christmas will begin, extending for twelve days until Epiphany, on January 6th.

At 5:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve (with a musical prelude beginning at 4:30 p.m.), we will have a service of Lessons & Carols in which the story of God's people will be told through Scripture and music, beginning in the Garden of Eden and culminating in the Incarnation of God in the child, Jesus. Until then, we live in the meantime of Advent, watching and waiting.

In its historical origins, the season of Advent was patterned after the season of Lent, a six-week period of penitence and preparation for Easter. Similarly, the four weeks of Advent present an opportunity for personal reflection, as the we prepare to celebrate the Nativity of Jesus and look with hope for Christ's return.

During our Sunday service on the four Sundays of Advent we will light candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, while reading and reflecting upon Scripture that speaks to those four Advent themes. Each week, in my own time of reflection, I will focus on that week's theme, and encourage you to do the same.

Advent 1 (December 1) - Hope Advent 2 (December 8) - Peace Advent 3 (December 15) - Joy Advent 4 (December 22) - Love

In the busyness of this month, let's all take time to look to Jesus Christ, our source of hope, peace, joy, and love, with expectation and gratitude.
